January 23, 2023 a big day for Harley Davidson, the big reveal. What did you think? Did you watch the big reveal? I did. Didn't see much that would make me buy a new bike this year. The anniversary year colors of red and other colors with red are nice but nothing that's going to make me want to buy a new bike. The only bike that caught my eye was the new trike ROAD GLIDE 3. There is now a trike that has a road glide fairing on it. It may be worth watching the video and taking it out on a test drive. Harley now has different categories of motorcycles; SPORT-3, CRUISER-8, ADVENTURE TOURING-2, GRAND AMERICAN TOURING-10, TRIKE-3 and ELECTRIC-1. I counted 27

different versions of Harley Davidson. How do you decide which is for you? Even with all of these options Harley still doesn't make what I would like for MY RIDE. Meanwhile Honda and BMW have features that Harley does not. The competitors make motorcycles that have reverse on their two wheel versions and ones that are automatic or very close to automatic. I would love reverse assist. In 2020 Harley added the hill assist feature to their clutch; after realizing that the hydraulic clutch on the previous years models was not liked by the riders. I believe introducing the Pan Am motorcycle was a good strategy for Harley Davidson to use in order to get the adventure riders introduced to the brand. I personally am intimidated by them based on the height of the seat and my ability to get on and off of the bike. Bill took one for a test drive and had difficulty maneuvering the gears because he was too big for it, so apparently someone between my height and his height is who the bike is made for. He said he did have a great suspension and a smooth ride though. My '17 Street Glide Special is safe from being traded in for another year. There's plenty of options available to make a bike your own. Sometimes a bike picks you.

This is Harley Davidson's 120th Anniversary and the 40th Anniversary for HOG. I am disappointed in the way that Harley rolled out the events for these celebrations. Tickets sales for the concerts were put up for sale to the public with no pre-notification of loyal Harley Davidson owners and HOG members. The cost of the tickets varied from day to day and increased in price the longer you waited. I personally am not interested in either of the headliner acts that they have for the music choices; however, the only way to get a ticket to ride in the parade was to buy a VIP ticket for close to \$200. It will be an interesting motorcycle rally with all of the non-rider people attending the concerts. I'm hopeful that Harley and HOG will make things right for the riders. As a reminder Fox Valley HOG has a block of rooms reserved at the Holiday Inn express and suites in Brookfield for those interested in staying overnight in Milwaukee during the rally. The rooms are first come first serve until gone.

The days are getting longer and the riding season will be here before we know it. I think all of the preparations we are doing now will pay off when it is time to ride. Thanks to all the Officers and members for the participation at the February meeting.

How to get your mileage recorded

To enter the 2023 NATIONAL and / or Chapter challenge, a mileage reading must be taken after January 1, 2023. National lifetime mileage carries over from year to year, but new readings must be taken each calendar year to participate.

Take a photo of the completed form and email to Donna Van Landghen for the Chapter mileage. Include which group to record your mileage to.
