April Fools!

No one knows for sure when or where the tradition jokes, pranks and tomfoolery came from. Sometime in the 1500's maybe, according to Wikipedia.

There's been many pranks played since, big and small. Remember 1996 where Taco Bell announced they were sponsoring the Liberty Bell and henceforth be known as the Taco Liberty Bell? Lots of people bought into that tomfoolery and caused an outrage that the National Park Service could ever do such a thing. April Fools! Taco Bell made a nice contribution to the Park Service once the prank was revealed.

It's a day of perpetrators and victims. Here's hoping you're not the latter.

The weather has finally changed, and riding season has started. I got the trike back from Appleton HD last Friday and while it was still a bit chilly then, it's good to know I can hop on nearly anytime and go for a ride.

We've got a few overnight long trips coming up this season and I'm here to help you get ready. April Fools! I can't actually help you pack.

Seriously, here's some packing ideas to be sure I pack wisely for a week on the road, courtesy of an old posting on the hog Website:

Lightweight synthetic clothing – such as T-shirts and underwear – can be washed in a hotel sink and dried overnight on a shower rod or towel rack (cotton fabrics take too long to dry in this manner).

Zipper-lock plastic bags of various sizes can be extremely useful for organizing items in saddlebags and duffle bags. They can make it easier to find and retrieve particular items without unpacking your entire motorcycle. Use the one-gallon size to pack one day's worth of clothes – jeans, undergarments, and shirt. This makes it easier to unpack just what you need.

Don't fold your clothes – roll them. They take up less space that way.

Pack items that have more than one use. For instance, don't pack just a pocketknife; pack a "Swiss-style" knife or multi-tool.

When traveling with other riders, conserve space by comparing packing lists. You may be able to avoid packing some duplicate items.

When traveling (two-up) with a spouse or "significant other", ask yourself tough questions such as: "Can we share a tube of toothpaste?" and "Can I get by using her shampoo for a week?"

On long trips, consider bringing your rattiest underwear (or other clothing) – then just throw it away when you're done with it!

Few things are as easy to pack as money or credit cards. If you're struggling with whether to bring a particular item, consider whether it's worth buying on the road if you end up needing it.

Don't forget to consider the weight of what you're packing, as well as the volume. Whenever possible, lighter is better. (And don't forget to check the cargo weight limits of your bike – as well as the bags and racks and adjust the tire pressure and suspension accordingly.) When loading your bike, keep as much weight as possible close to the bike's center of gravity. That means low and toward the tank, distributed evenly from side to side. Remember to check your owner's manual for the cargo weight limits of your bike.

A day or two before you leave, do a dry run. Pack the bike and go for a short ride, then adjust the load as needed.

If you're camping, set up your tent once or twice before you leave (and don't forget to waterproof it). Practice setting it up in the dark. To save space, roll up some of your clothes in your sleeping bag.

Pack all your cold weather and raingear no matter what time of year it is.

Plastic bags make great boot liners if you forgot your gaiters. If you forgot your rain gloves, rubber dishwashing gloves make great, inexpensive substitutes.

A small towel can be wrapped around your neck during a rainstorm to keep water from running down your back – and doubles as a shop rag.



A recent email from Harley-Davidson Clothing & Gear reminds us that April is:

“Check your Helmet Month”.

Per Harley-Davidson Clothing & Gear, here is a:

4-STEP HELMET SAFETY CHECK

1

MAKE SURE IT STILL FITS

Make sure it fits snugly and that your full range of vision is unobstructed.

2

LOOK FOR SIGNS OF DAMAGE

Any helmet that has been dropped onto a hard surface or shows dents in the shell or fraying of the straps should be replaced immediately.

3

THINK ABOUT LIFESPAN

Even if it doesn't appear damaged, it's highly recommended to replace your helmet every 3-5 years.

4

KNOW YOUR LOCAL LAWS

Different states have different motorcycle helmet rules, so make sure you're up to date.

These are the rules regarding helmets when riding motorcycle in Wisconsin, taken directly from the Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicle website:

Helmet

- Required for all operators and passengers under the age of 18
- Operators are subject to fines and demerit points for carrying passengers (on a motorcycle or in a sidecar) under the age of 18 who aren't wearing a properly fitted helmet
- Helmets are required for all operators with motorcycle instruction permits and their passengers
- Strongly recommended for use by all motorcycle and moped riders

Must meet or exceed US DOT minimum standards

Welcome to the 2023 'All Season' Chapter Fun Run. This event is designed purely for the pleasure and entertainment of its participants. Each member is expected to keep safety and good sportsmanship a top priority and most of all- just have fun!! (This is not an organized chapter event so you ride at your own risk.)

Fun Run hands will be drawn at the November, December '23, and January '24 Chapter meetings.

** If you are unable to make it to Chapter meetings due to work or other obligations, contact John and Cindy Siegel (cseagull01@gmail.com) to arrange an alternate time to draw your hand. The winners will be announced at the Holiday Party in 2024 (or at the next chapter meeting, should there be no party.)

THE GUIDELINES: (If you have any questions regarding the Run, please contact John or Cindy Siegel.)

1) **Participants must be current members** of Fox Valley-WI HOG. Each riding member may include one guest

with their registration. All participants must be 18 yrs. or older.

2) **Cost is \$7.00 each per person** (non-refundable) - payable at time of registration. (Participant + Guest = \$14.00)

3) **REGISTRATION DEADLINE: The July Chapter Meeting**

(New chapter members may register upon joining the chapter.)

4) Participants are responsible for their own safety and for the routes to the destinations.

5) Stops can be run in any order you want- at any time during the riding season.

6) **Participants must provide a photo of you and your motorcycle, showing the official name in the photo.**

[City limits sign, post office, police station, community center or business which includes name, destination sign, etc.]

Participants are responsible for all film and photos.

Pictures must be printed but can be printed on standard paper.

Multiple pictures per page is allowable, however the sign must be clearly visible.

(Due to time constraints and small screen size, we will NOT view photos on your camera.)

Pictures will be returned after the drawing.

NOTE: Singles- If you are traveling alone, you may provide a photo of your bike and the sign.

Couples- Only one photo per stop is required if the photo shows both of you and your bike

7) Participant receives one drawing per stop. **You need not complete all stops to draw cards.**

Example: 3 pictures = 3 cards 4 pictures = 4 cards 5 pictures = 5 cards (plus eligible for dollar option)

8) Dollar Option- If at least 5 of the 6 destinations are completed, an option card may be purchased for \$1.00.

Dollar option funds going into the fun run "pot".

9) In case of a tie, the two high hands will cut the cards and high card will win.

All rulings by the judges are final!

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS FOR THE FOX VALLEY WISCONSIN HARLEY OWNERS GROUP**CONSTITUTION****ARTICLE NO. 1**

All members of this chapter will follow and adhere to the "Charter For Local Chapters" set forth By the Harley owners group international office, Milwaukee, Wisconsin and any additional "articles of constitution and by-laws" as deemed necessary by a majority vote of active members of this chapter. Changes to the chapters constitution and bylaws must be done according to the following procedure:

1. Proposed change must be submitted in writing to the chapter Director.
2. The Director will forward the written proposal to the chapter sponsor. The sponsor reserves the right to approve or reject all proposals within 30 days. If rejected, the proposal will be denied and no further action will be taken
3. If approved by the sponsor, the proposal will be brought up for discussion at the next two consecutive meetings. Following discussion at the second meeting, a vote will be taken. A majority of all members present and virtual at the meeting will carry the vote.

Articles related to the elected and appointed officers of the chapter will follow the H.O.G. Charter. Those articles listed in the Fox Valley Wisconsin chapter Inc. Bylaws are in addition to the H.O.G. Charter.

ARTICLE NO. 3

The duties of the Director shall:

- Uphold National HOG charter
- Coordinate chapter officers responsibilities
- Preside at meetings of the club

ARTICLE NO. 4

The duties of the assistant Director shall:

- Promote membership, membership orientation, and membership retention
- Keep members informed of HOG programs

ARTICLE NO. 5

The duties of the secretary shall:

- Keep a record of all chapter meetings

ARTICLE NO. 6

The duties of the treasurer shall:

- Collect and disperse chapter funds

ARTICLE NO. 7

The duties of the road captain shall:

- Assist in route planning

ARTICLE NO. 8

The duties of the ladies of Harley officer shall:

Encourage women members to take part in chapter activities

ARTICLE NO. 9

The duties of the safety officer shall:

Provide safety information to members

ARTICLE NO. 10

The duties of the editor shall:

Organize written material for the chapter, such as newsletters flyers and press releases

ARTICLE NO. 11

The activities officer shall:

Administer chapter events

ARTICLE NO. 12

The duties of the membership officer shall be:

Based on H.O.G. Charter

ARTICLE NO. 13

The duties of the Webmaster officer shall be:

Based on H.O.G. Charter

ARTICLE NO. 14

The duties of the chapter photographer shall be:

Based on H.O.G. Charter

ARTICLE NO. 15

The primary elective officers; Director, assistant Director, treasurer, and secretary, will be filled at an annual election to be held during the December meeting of each year. All other positions will be filled by volunteers. If there are multiple volunteers seeking a position, the position will be decided by vote. If there are no volunteers, the position may be left open if not a primary officer.

All officers shall hold office for one year, beginning January 1, or until their successors are elected and qualified.

Voting for officers shall proceed as follows:

Only active members are eligible to vote. (An "active member" must be current members of both the chapter and national HOG.)

The offices will be voted on one at a time in order of: Director, Assistant Director, Treasurer, and Secretary. All other offices will follow.

If a member accepts nomination for more than one office, their name will be dropped from the remaining ballots if he/she is elected to an upper office

In person and virtual votes will be tabulated at the December chapter meeting those participants online may vote at the time of the meeting.

ARTICLE NO. 16

The regular meeting of this chapter shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at 6:30 PM. The Director or primary officers may call a special meeting at any time by advance notice.

ARTICLE NO. 17

Any majority number of active members at a regularly scheduled meeting shall constitute a quorum for transaction of chapter business.

ARTICLE NO. 18

The first 26 paid members will be considered charter members.

BYLAWS

NUMBER 1. Roberts rules of order shall govern the parliamentary proceedings of this chapter unless provided in the bylaws.

1. Report of officers
2. Unfinished business

New business

NUMBER 2. Spouses or riding partners may attend functions without becoming members *for a maximum of 3 times before joining the chapter . Nonmembers are not eligible for chapter prizes.*

NUMBER 3. Individuals interested in becoming members may attend three meetings before joining. After a verbal commitment to join they have until the next scheduled meeting to pay the dues, if applicable.

NUMBER 4. Membership will run from January 1 to December 31 of the calendar year. Chapter dues are \$12 per year. Those that join in November or December will be exempt from paying dues. Promotional Chapter membership for the first year will be given to new National HOG members if new to Fox Valley WI HOG.

NUMBER 5. The Director should be made aware of all bills that are paid.

Any abnormal purchase over \$100 must be preapproved by the membership at a regularly scheduled monthly meeting.

The treasurer must sign all checks. If the treasurer is unavailable the Director may sign a check in an emergency situation. *The treasurer and Director will have access to a debit card to cover chapter expenses.*

Bank statements must be audited by the *director and one other officer quarterly at the officers meeting.*

NUMBER 6. *The Sponsor / Representative will have access to all chapter financial records when/if requested by the sponsor or representatives.*

NUMBER 7. When the ride reaches its final destination and the kickstands are down the ride is considered over.

NUMBER 8. All Fox Valley Wisconsin HOG chapter rides are drug and alcohol free. Appleton Harley Davidson, HOG and the Fox Valley Wisconsin HOG chapter have a zero tolerance policy.

Consumption of altering substances prior to or during breaks on a scheduled ride is prohibited.
