#### Mileage Corner

As of Saturday, December 9, 2023, our chapter is ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in our region and 40<sup>th</sup> in National. This is amazing! National has our chapter listed with 434,211 miles ridden for those members you are in the 2023 mileage challenge.

Based on the Harley National Mileage report, I did send out an email to members that appeared to have not have a year end total for 2023 in miles.

If you are not participating in the National Mileage or Chapter mileage – that is totally ok. However, If you wanted to be part of the mileage challenge you may want to work with the dealership or Harley National to get your account current.

Any dealership can record your miles. You need to check with that dealership on when the last day they will read and ENTER your miles on the national site.

On the National website, you can see what was recorded for you. Log into your account, then go to Ride 365. It will show; (1) your personal Lifetime miles, (2) your annual miles, (3) and the Chapter total miles. Today as I was looking at our details, I found that I was only 58 miles from earning my next badge from National. Ugh.

At the chapter annual party in January, details of our mileage will be shared.

#### Motorcycle Winter Storage Myths: **Avoid These Common Storage Mistakes**

October 11, 2023

Having to put your bike away for the winter is bad enough for avid riders. But, the last thing you want is to find come springtime is a bike that's in worse shape than when you first put it away.

Unfortunately, as with any area of motorcycle maintenance, there are some motorcycle storage myths floating around that can lead to unfortunate consequences. As you get ready to winterize and stow away your bike, be sure to avoid these common mistakes and ensure that your bike is ready to hit the road when the cold season finally comes to an end.

#### MYTH #1 - YOU SHOULD DRAIN THE FUEL TANK

Leaving your bike's fuel tank empty makes it susceptible to corrosion and can dry out its seals. Instead of draining the tank, fill the tank before you stow your bike away and add a high-quality fuel stabilizer according to the manufacturer's instructions. This additive will help keep fuel from breaking down and clogging parts while making sure your fuel tank can stay full.

## MYTH #2 – ANY KIND OF MOTORCYCLE COVER WILL

Using a cover made from durable and breathable material is crucial to preventing the build-up of moisture on your bike's surface during storage. That means avoiding low-quality materials and items not intended to be used as motorcycle covers, like tarps.

Some riders, in an attempt to avoid moisture build-up or save on costs, will opt to forgo a cover altogether. This approach, particularly when done outside, leaves your bike exposed to the elements as well as accidents. Instead, we highly recommend investing in a guality motorcycle cover—it's a simple way to help protect your investment for more than just one season.

#### MYTH #3 – YOU SHOULD START YOUR BIKE UP ONCE A WEEK

There's a misguided bit of conventional wisdom we often see that tells riders to fire up their bike about once per week during winter to warm it up, keep it in shape, or prevent the battery from dying. Our advice: do not start your bike in winter unless you plan to take it out for a ride. It takes a lot of energy to start your bike in the cold. And it's getting it up to normal operating temperature and taking it for a ride that actually provides some benefits to your bike: It's during a ride that your battery will recharge and that harmful moisture will be heated away .

When you're not riding your bike, rather than occasionally starting it up or disconnecting the battery altogether, simply connect your battery to a Harley-Davidson Dual Mode Battery Charger. Our dual mode battery chargers are ideal for short- or long-term motorcycle battery charging needs. These chargers are completely automatic. You can leave these chargers plugged in 24/7 with no worries of overcharging.

#### MYTH #4 – IT'S FINE TO STORE A DIRTY BIKE

This mistake is simple to understand, but it's still made by too many riders. Failing to thoroughly clean your bike before long-term storage doesn't just mean you'll have more work to do in spring. Instead, it often means your bike will come out the other side of winter looking even worse, as all that dirt and grime continues working its way into the bike's materials and begins to cause corrosion. We recommend conducting a thorough cleaning of your bike before storing it.

#### MYTH #5 - YOU SHOULD REMOVE YOUR MOTORCY-CLE'S BATTERY

Removing your <u>motorcycle's battery</u> is not only unnecessary, but it still may lead to the battery self-discharging. The best approach (during both winter and other longer-term storage periods) is to properly install a <u>dual mode</u> <u>battery charger</u> that will help maintain and prolong the life of your battery.

## MYTH #6 – YOU SHOULD OVERINFLATE YOUR BIKE'S TIRES

Filling motorcycle tires with too much air places undue pressure on the tires and can lead to cracking in cold conditions. More commonly, it can lead to flat spots forming on the tires. As part of your storage preparation, be sure to check for proper inflation as dictated by your owner's manual. And to avoid the risk of flat spots further, store your motorcycle on a center stand. However, if you don't have a proper stand, be sure to rotate your tires at least once per month during the storage period.

# MYTH #7 - MOTORCYCLE SECURITY DOESN'T MATTER IN THE WINTER

Unfortunately, bike thieves don't take the winter off. Keep your bike safe no matter where it's being stored with the right <u>motorcycle locks</u> and anti-theft measures like <u>security systems</u>.

Stay warm, stay safe. Merry Christmas, Happy New Year.
