So I can't wait for spring so I can resume ignoring household projects and get back to riding. Anytime now would be good.



THE SAFETY ZONE:

Helmets:



- *Helmet life is 5 years for warranty.
- *Check straps, screws on visor, shell for damage, and foam for cracks or deterioration.
- *Check inside liner for hair care product residue, clean if necessary.
- *Placing anything on the helmet could result in the breakdown of the shell material. (Stickers/changing the color/etc.)
- *DOT or Snell label shows the helmet was made to the highest standards and will provide adequate protection.
- *When traveling, check which states require helmets, etc. Laws change often, check before traveling.
